Mr. B's Inclusive Playground is Open for All

Mr. B's Inclusive Playground officially opened in early October with a ribbon cutting ceremony. Located at the John A. Anderson Recreation Center, the state-ofthe-art accessible playground is now open for children of all abilities.

The boundless playground is named after longtime Recreation Superintendent Anthony Brunetta, better known as Mr. B, who passed away in 2016. Mr. B served the Village for nearly six decades with his exemplarily work ethic and devotion to the youth of Rockville Centre.

"Mr. B touched countless lives and today we honor his legacy, which is memorialized in this state-of-the-art playground that I know he would have loved," said Mayor Francis X. Murray. "It will serve as a permanent reminder how Mr. B helped us to grow, and in turn he left his mark on us."

The playground was built at no cost to the taxpayers after the Village succeeded in raising more than \$2 million from grants and community organizations. Grants from the New York State Dormitory Authority, former Assemblywoman Judy Griffin, former New York State Senator Todd Kaminsky and donations from generous community groups including the Rockville Centre Lions Club, Tommy Brull Foundation Inc., the Rockville Centre Little League, Feil Family Foundation,



Rockville Centre PBA, RVC Speaks, Francis F. Wilson Elementary School, Lindsay's, and the Tim McMullan Memorial Fund brought this project to fruition.

Mr. B's Playground features a sensory dome and play structures with ramps that are sure to provide countless hours of entertainment for all to enjoy. The grants secured also allowed for upgrades to Veterans Park, located directly behind the new playground, including new ADA-compliant restrooms, LED lighting, new walking track, tennis, pickleball, and basketball courts.

"It's projects like this that makes me proud to be your Mayor. Everyone came together and took an idea from a dream to a reality and in turn reached another milestone for our Village in achieving inclusion for all," added Mayor Murray.

January Tree Pick-ups

Discarded Christmas trees will be picked up from the curb-strip beginning on Monday, January 6, 2025, on your regular scheduled garbage collection day. Discarded trees will be picked up by the Village. Please remove all lights, decorations, and tree stands.

Tax Office Announcements

Second half 2024/25 Village tax bills are scheduled to be mailed out on November 20, 2024. Second half taxes must be paid by January 2, 2025, to avoid any penalties.

Real estate tax exemptions are available to volunteer firefighters with five years or more of certified service and to veterans based on the date and type of military service.

The maximum assessed value that may be exempted varies with the status of the veteran claimant: non-combat and Cold War \$518; combat \$864; and disabled up to \$1,728 based on the percent of disability.

Real estate tax exemptions are also available to disabled homeowners and to senior homeowners 65 and older with a 2023 gross income not exceeding \$58,399.

Exemption applications are available on the Village website www.rvcny.gov on the Tax Office page, by emailing taxoffice@rvcny.us or by calling the Tax Office Monday to Friday, 8am – 4pm at (516)678-9205.

The filing deadline for all 2025/26 exemption applications is January 2, 2025.

New property owners and those who have satisfied, refinanced or sold their mortgage to another lending institution should contact the Tax Office as soon as possible either by email at taxoffice@rvcny.us or telephone at (516) 678-9205 in order to avoid billing errors that may lead to penalties for late real estate tax

Weather Reminders and Tips Winter weather is making its regularly

scheduled appearance in Rockville Centre with cold weather temperatures and the possibility of snow. In the event of a snowstorm, the Village urges residents to not go out during or immediately after unless it is necessary. Crews will be able to do their job more quickly and completely if there is less traffic on the roads. The Department of Public Works is responsible for plowing 53 miles of roads, 30 parking fields and all Village owned sidewalks. Throughout the storm the DPW will use over 20 pieces of snow equipment including snowplow vehicles, dump trucks, and payloaders. In addition, DPW will be using four small plows and four snow blowers for walks and ramps.

Please Remember:

- All sidewalks must be cleared within 24 hours after the end of a storm.
- Snow should not be thrown into the roadway when clearing your driveways and sidewalks.
- Snow and ice should be cleared from the fire hydrants near your home so that they are clear, visible and accessible, which will allow emergency responders to act more quickly in

- While out shoveling your sidewalk, keep an eye on your storm drains. Helping to clear them of snow, ice and debris will prevent flooding as temperatures rise.
- Remove vehicles from street parking. This allows plows to clear more snow, which will make driving and parking easier and safer after a storm.
- Individuals who rely on electricity to operate life-sustaining electronic equipment, such as a respirator or dialysis machine, should alert the electric department, police department and fire departments of their needs, in case of emergency. Customers with life-sustaining equipment should also have emergency back-up equipment on hand, since immediate power restoration cannot be
- If you must go out during hazardous driving conditions, please remember to drive slowly, brake slowly, allow plenty of room between you and the vehicle in front of you, and watch for sudden obstruction. Give yourself plenty of



Garbage should be placed in standard garbage containers with <u>detachable</u> lids.

NO LARGER THAN 32 GALLONS

Garbage should not exceed 50 pounds.

Please do not over fill plastic garbage bags as they can easily tear.

To prevent injury to our village employees, please use caution when disposing of any broken glass or sharp objects. Please securely wrap broken glass in newspaper or brown paper or place inside cardboard box, tape shut and label broken glass. Do not place broken glass in plastic bags.

E-Cycling:

Drop off your e-cycling items on the first Saturday of every month between 10am and 2pm at 10 Sunrise Hwy including: Televisions, Computers, Monitors, VCRs, DVDs, iPads, Cable boxes, Cameras or Video Cameras, Telephones (any type), GPS, Calculators
